This is brand new course material with information of great importance to the traditions and history of our church! All laity are invited to participate in Lay Servant Ministries courses, not just persons seeking to become a Lay Servant.

Class Leaders: Recovering a Tradition

This study explains what the recovery of this tradition can mean for congregations, and offers some guidelines for the revitalized office of class leader. It is based on the book, [“Class Leaders: Recovering a Tradition”](#) by David Lowes Watson. In 1988 the General Conference restored class leaders and class meetings to the Book of Discipline after a 50-year absence.

Watson shows how class leaders, under the supervision of the pastor, can nurture the discipline of other church members in light of a “General Rule of Discipline” derived from the early Methodist societies: “To witness to Jesus Christ in the world, and to follow his teachings through acts of compassion, justice, worship, and devotion, under the guidance of the Holy Spirit.” This advanced course will equip the lay servant for service in many facets of lay ministry and congregational leadership.
